

Nature in Neighborhoods capital grants

- Funds projects that increase nature at the neighborhood scale
- Partnerships between public agencies and community organizations in housing, transit, transportation, library, health, school and others
- \$5.2 M through 2 rounds of capital grants to 12 projects (2023, 2024)
- \$2.3 M through the first round of community choice grants to 15 projects (capital grants pilot, 2024)
- 3rd round of capital grants (2025)
- 2nd round of community choice grants (2026)

2025 Capital Grants

\$5 million available

Grant awards of \$100,000 to \$1,000,000

Up to five years total

Capital Assets

Capital Grants can only be used to fund capital projects.

- Partnerships between community-based organizations and public (non-federal) agencies.
- Final asset must be publically owned.
- Bond proceeds must be spent on capital costs.



Land acquisition

Would privately owned property in your community make the next great neighborhood natural area?

Urban transformations

Can a redevelopment project in your community go the extra step to integrate nature and habitat if more funding is available?

Restoration

Is there a degraded stream, wetland or other habitat that needs to be restored in your neighborhood?

Neighborhood livability

Can schools, parks or other public land in your neighborhood become a place for people to experience and enjoy nature?

Purpose

 To improve water quality, protect fish and wildlife habitat and connect people to nature

Bond criteria

- Advance racial equity
- Prepare for climate change
- Conduct meaningful engagement



Community Engagement and Racial Equity Criteria

- Meaningfully engage with communities of color in planning, development and selection of projects
- Prioritize projects and needs identified by communities of color
- Demonstrate accountability for tracking outcomes and reporting impacts
- Improve the accessibility and inclusiveness
- Prevent or mitigate displacement and/or gentrification
- Workforce diversity and use of COBID contractors

Climate Resilience Criteria (Choose at least one)

- Protect, connect and restore habitat to support strong populations of native plants, fish and wildlife
- Protect and restore floodplains, headwaters, streams and wetlands
- Increase tree canopy
- Use low-impact development practices and green infrastructure
- Invest in the regional trail system to expand active transportation opportunities

PN Bond Program Criteria Capital Grants (Choose at least one)

- Improve human mental and physical health
- Build wealth in communities of color
- People of color design and implement projects
- Nurture a relationship with land, create educational opportunities, promote environmental and agricultural careers
- Partner with Indigenous people
- Create accessibility for people experiencing disabilities
- Access to nature from transit, walking and biking
- Consider houselessness in a sensitive and humanizing way

Full applications due Spring 2025

Recommendation to Metro Council in Summer 2025

Grant agreements and notice to proceed by Fall 2025 to Summer 2027

Describe how the project addresses the Nature in Neighborhood Capital Grants purpose, principles and program criteria.

9. Meaningful community engagement and racial equity (up to one page, 4000 characters)

Describe how the project address the Parks and Nature Bond criteria. How do communities of color and the community served help to identify the need for, design, and deliver this project?

10. Climate resiliency (up to one page, 4000 characters)

Describe how the project address the Parks and Nature Bond criteria and further the region's climate resilience.

11. Partnerships (up to one page, 4000 characters)

Show how partnerships and collaboration with other individuals, organizations and groups in your community will be formed, strengthened and extended through this program.

12. Organizational preparedness (up to one page, 4000 characters)

Explain why your organization and your partners have the experience and capacity to conduct the program, including identification of key personnel, their roles in the program and their qualifications.
