New affordable housing at Elmonica will be 81 apartments in a mix of sizes with studios near larger units for an extended family member to live nearby. Features such as a festival street, central plaza, gathering spaces and programming guided by themes from community engagement support a sense of community and belonging.

The site is in the Five Oaks/Triple Creek area near MAX and bus; design supports pedestrian and social connection between residents and neighbors. Outdoor amenities include accessible community gardens, play structures, and a picnic lawn area. An indoor community room with full kitchen, secure bike parking, food pantry and laundry rooms on each residential floor make day to day life easier for residents.

The building uses universal design, includes automatic door openers, accessible units and units for people with hearing impairments. Other features include in unit mini-split air conditioning, energy saving appliances and a rooftop solar array to offset energy usage.

A full-time resident services coordinator and several promotores will collaborate with other community resources to provide comprehensive and culturally specific support to residents. Services focus on financial stability, basic needs, housing safety and other topics, with multicultural and multi-lingual opportunities for all residents.

The development team, including REACH CDC, Salazar Architects, Colas Construction, Bienestar, Mercy Housing Northwest and HomePlate, has deep roots in Washington County.

Elmonica is 81 units of affordable family apartments in Beaverton designed with a community-centered vision for multigenerational living.
